American Committee Welcomes New Board Member Eleni Daniels



The American Committee President, Michael J. Reppas II, Esq., announced today that journalist and public relations consultant Eleni Daniels has joined the Board of The American Committee for the Reunification of the Parthenon Sculptures, Inc., and will serve as Director of Public Relations. WELCOME ABOARD ELENI! To her role, Eleni brings over 15 years experience in public relations, communications, and business development including a longtime affiliation with the Greek Community in the U.S., as a journalist and public radio talk host and producer. As president and principal of DanielsMedia, she and her team provides consulting services in public relations, publicity, and corporate communications with an emphasis on the arts, education, health/medical, entertainment, lifestyle, among others. Her passion for education and the perpetuation of Hellenic culture is evident in recent major national and international undertakings.

This includes the successful launch of “Gods, Myths and Mortals: Discover Ancient Greece” a 4,000 sq. ft. high-tech national touring exhibition currently open in New York at the Children’s Museum of Manhattan (CMOM) through September 2010. Since its opening in May 2007, the exhibit has attracted over half a million visitors and has introduced children and families to the world of ancient Greece through a dynamic interactive environment designed to engage them both intellectually and emotionally. There, Eleni introduced a replica model of the ancient Greek marvel “The Antikythera Mechanism” (aka the “world’s first computer”) in collaboration with the Antikythera Mechanism Research Project in Greece and the UK. And the groundbreaking international research and teaching collaboration between Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and the University of Patras, championed by Mr. John G. Rangos, Sr., among other projects.

Eleni began her career as journalist in 1993 at public radio station WNYE in New York with Hellenic Public Radio-Cosmos FM (HPR), the nation’s only daily bilingual public radio program. She is presently Executive Producer/On-air Host of “All Things Greek,” a radio journal with a Hellenic scope reaching over 13 million households in NY, NJ, CT and Long Island on 91.5FM and online. During her tenure as Executive Director of HPR, she led a winning campaign to keep the ethnic Greek voice alive on WNYE. She has produced and hosted a variety of arts & culture, public affairs and women’s programs including *Greek through the Ages*, *Eye on the Community*, *The Coffee Hour*, *Corporate Focus*, etc. She is known for her insightful interviews with notable personalities such as former First Lady Margarita Papandreou, dramatic actor Irene Pappas, singer Nana Mouskouri, composer Mimis Plessas, former AOL marketing mogul Ted Leonsis, actor Nia Vardalos, among others. Eleni has also served as Associate Editor at The Orthodox Observer; Director of Communications with the NY State Senate, and in 2001, was honored by former NY State Governor George Pataki and U.S. Congresswoman Carolyn Maloney for “Outstanding Service to the Community.” Eleni holds a BA degree from CUNY Queens College with French studies at Laval University. She is a native of New York and speaks fluent Greek, French and Italian. Her daughter is a freshman at SUNY Purchase College, and her parents are originally from Greece.
